MINUTES OF MEETING

A meeting of the Mayor and City Council of the City of West Point, Nebraska was convened in open and public session at 5:37 PM on Tuesday, March 1, 2022 in the Council Chambers at City Hall, 444 S. Main Street, West Point, Nebraska.

Present were: Mayor Bruce A. Schlecht; Councilmembers: Ryan Penrose, Tom Swenson, Mark Buse, Jerry Hugo (arrived at 5:44 PM), and Rusty Smith. Absent: None.

The Mayor called the meeting to order and stated that in accordance with State Statute Section 84-1412 the Open Meetings Act is posted on the west wall of the Council Chambers for public information.

The Mayor then opened a public hearing at 5:38 PM on the Redevelopment Plan of the City of West Point for the Wooldrik Commercial Development Project. Mark Wooldrik and Mike Bacon, attorney, were present at the hearing. Mark Wooldrik appeared before the Council to talk about the Wooldrik Commercial Development Project. Said project intends to utilize Tax Increment Financing funds for the construction of two buildings which will provide for expansion of services and create additional good paying jobs in the City of West Point. Mr. Wooldrik started his business 15 years ago which has expanded into several businesses and has outgrown its current facility. It was stated that the West Point Planning Commission held a public hearing on this matter and after consideration, was recommending that the Community Development Agency and the City Council approve and adopt the Redevelopment Plan. All parties were given an opportunity to be heard. No one spoke in opposition of the plan and no correspondence had been filed. At approximately 5:42 PM the Mayor closed the public hearing. Smith offered the following resolution and moved for its passage and adoption:

RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WEST POINT, NEBRASKA, APPROVING THE CITY OF WEST POINT REDEVELOPMENT PLAN FOR THE WOOLDRIK COMMERCIAL DEVELOPMENT PROJECT; APPROVAL OF A REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT OF THE CITY OF WEST POINT; AND APPROVAL OF RELATED ACTIONS.

The foregoing Resolution having been read, Swenson seconded the motion for its passage and adoption. The following councilmembers voted in favor of the passage and adoption of said

Resolution: Penrose, Swenson, Buse, and Smith. The following councilmembers voted against the same: None. The following councilmembers were absent or did not vote: Hugo. The result of the vote being 4 Yeas and 0 Nays, the Mayor declared the motion carried and said resolution adopted. A true and correct copy of said Resolution is attached to these minutes.

At 5:44 PM it was moved by Swenson and seconded by Smith to recess as the City Council and reconvene as the Community Development Agency of the City of West Point, Nebraska. Voting: Penrose, Swenson, Buse, and Smith. Nay: None. Motion carried. At 5:50 PM the Mayor and Council reconvened as the City Council.

The Mayor then submitted his nominee being Shea Stokely to fill the vacancy on the City Council created by the resignation of Councilmember Emma Stokely of Ward 1. Moved by Smith and seconded by Buse to approve the appointment of Shea Stokely to fill the vacancy on the City Council for Ward 1 until December, 2022. Voting Yea: Penrose, Swenson, Buse, Hugo, and Smith. Nay: None. Motion carried. Shea Stokely was then sworn in.

Moved by Smith, seconded by Swenson, to approve the claim of Hugo Plumbing & Heating

for services and supplies in the amount of \$13,143.30. Voting Yea: Stokely, Penrose, Swenson, Buse, and Smith. Nay: None. Abstaining: Hugo. Motion carried.

The City Administrator informed the Council that he has been advised that the Power Drive Rally is scheduled to be held on Saturday, April 2nd in Neligh Park, the same as in previous years. This is a school program in which students build electric cars to specific structure and safety requirements and then race them against other schools.

Penrose gave an update from the Swimming Pool Committee and that communications will be going out to support the ballot question, being an increase in the local option sales tax to pay for a new swimming pool, which will be on the ballot at the May election.

The City Administrator stated that the berm project along the levy by the Army Corp of Engineers is almost complete. Grass needs to be resown and replacement trees planted on the property acquired from Danny Johnson. Hopefully, the next phase being the raising of the levy will then proceed.

Moved by Swenson seconded by Smith, to adjourn at 5:59 PM. Voting Yea: Stokely, Penrose, Swenson, Buse, Hugo, and Smith. Nay: None. Motion carried.
