The Mayor then opened a public hearing on the request of Ed Bracht to subdivide real estate located in Addition "H" to the City of West Point. The City Administrator reviewed the plat with the Council and he advised that the Planning Commission was forwarding a favorable recommendation.

All parties were given an opportunity to be heard. No one appeared to speak in opposition of the subdivision and no correspondence had been filed. The Mayor then closed the public hearing. Stokely introduced Ordinance No. 1427 entitled:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WEST POINT, NEBRASKA ACCEPTING THE PLAT AND DEDICATION OF CLAY HOLLOW 2<sup>ND</sup> SUBDIVISION, A SUBDIVISION LOCATED IN ADDITION "H" TO THE CITY OF WEST POINT, CUMING COUNTY, NEBRASKA; ACCEPTING THE DEDICATION OF THE STREETS THEREIN FOR PUBLIC USE; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; PRESCRIBING THE TIME WHEN THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE IN FULL FORCE AND TAKE EFFECT; AND PROVIDING FOR THE PUBLICATION OF THIS ORDINANCE IN PAMPHLET FORM,

and moved that the statutory rule requiring reading on three different days be suspended. Smith seconded the motion. Voting Yea: Stokely, Penrose, Swenson, Buse, Hugo, and Smith. Nay: None. Motion carried. Statutory rule suspended. Buse moved for final passage of the ordinance, which motion was seconded by Swenson. Voting Yea: Stokely, Penrose, Swenson, Buse, Hugo, and Smith. Nay: None. Ordinance adopted.

The Mayor then opened a public hearing on the request of Jennifer Batenhorst for a special use permit to allow for a beauty salon as a home occupation business, located within a Residential Single Family District at 820 E. Grant Street. A separate building will be built for the salon with adequate parking. Jennifer Batenhorst was present to answer questions. The City Administrator advised that the Planning Commission was forwarding a favorable recommendation. No one appeared to speak in opposition of this request and no correspondence had been filed. The Mayor then closed the public hearing. Smith introduced a resolution that a Special Use Permit be granted to allow for a beauty salon as a home occupation business at 820 E. Grant Street located within the Residential Single Family District. Penrose seconded the motion. Voting Yea: Stokely, Penrose, Swenson, Buse, Hugo, and Smith. Nay: None. Motion carried and said resolution adopted.

Tina Biteghe Bi Ndong, Executive Director of the West Point Chamber of Commerce, appeared before the Council and presented the quarterly report on the Chamber's economic development activities. Moved by Smith and seconded to Stokely to accept the report and approve the payment of \$5,000 for services January-March, 2022. Voting Yea: Stokely, Penrose, Swenson, Buse, Hugo, and Smith. Nay: None. Motion carried.

The Council considered the request of Cuming County Public Power District for use of city streets for a Fun Run on Saturday, April 23, 2022. The proposed route was reviewed. Moved by

Penrose and seconded by Hugo to approve this request. Voting Yea: Stokely, Penrose, Swenson, Buse, Hugo, and Smith. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Drew Wimer, Vice-President of West Point Rescue, appeared before the Council to discussion the suspension system on the 2009 Road Rescue Ambulance (Unit #992) which is the second oldest unit. This unit currently has an air-bag system and needs to be repaired. They would like to upgrade to a hydraulic system at a cost of approximately \$25,000 which is not in the rescue's current budget. Therefore, they are requesting to use sales tax funds for this improvement. It was also stated that West Point Rural Fire Protection District would be splitting this cost. Moved by Hugo and seconded by Swenson to approve this request. Voting Yea: Stokely, Penrose, Swenson, Buse, Hugo, and Smith. Nay: None. Motion carried.

The Council then considered the request from the Campaign Manager of Mike Flood to waive the City regulation regarding political signs need to be removed 5 days after an election. With the primary election being on May 10<sup>th</sup> and a special election being on June 28<sup>th</sup>, signs would only end up being down for approx. 12 days. Moved by Stokely and seconded by Hugo that the City waive the regulation of removing political signs 5 days after the May 10<sup>th</sup> election for only those candidates on the ballot for the special election to be held June 28<sup>th</sup>. Voting Yea: Stokely, Penrose, Swenson, Buse, Hugo, and Smith. Nay: None. Motion carried.

The City Administrator then proceeded to report, on behalf of the Economic Development Committee, the following LB 840 Economic Development applications:

- 1. Brockmann Insurance -- requesting \$40,000 as a new business start up to renovate and update outside of building, remodel inside to a professional environment including updating technology and office equipment. The Committee is recommending a \$5,000 grant.
- 2. CCLB Thor LLC (Chiropractic Clinic) -- requesting \$200,000 to renovate the former Bubbles of Joy building. Complete renovation of the outside and all levels of the building to utilize for commercial space. Structural re-composition of the first floor, roof repair, electrical wiring, HVAC, plumbing and restoration of the marquee. The Committee is recommending a \$70,000 grant.
- 3. Oak Barn Beef -- requesting \$96,000 to renovate the former Davis Auto Sale building at 706 S. Lincoln Street installation of a 20x30 foot freezer, storage space for shipping boxes and operate Oak Barn Beef's online retail orders. The Committee is recommending a \$45,000 grant.
- 4. Expanse Team Inc. -- requesting \$140,000 to purchase and install an elevator that will stop on all floors and provide easier access to the second floor and will also facilitate storage of extra tables and chairs in the basement for event space. The Committee is recommending a \$70,000 grant.
- 5. Indy Express LLC (Logemann Auto Parts) -- requesting \$175,000 to purchase the building on 590 S. Main Street and plan to construct a warehouse addition to the current structure. The Committee is recommending a \$70,000 grant.

The City Administrator advised that each grant would be for a period of five years and on the condition that the business is operating at the address specified in the Economic Development Assistance Agreement. Moved by Smith and seconded by Stokely to approve the recommendations of the Economic Development Committee for grants from the LB 840 Economic Development Funds as presented. Voting Yea: Stokely, Penrose, Swenson, Buse, Hugo, and Smith. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Next on the agenda was the LB 840 Economic Development program six-month report. The City Administrator stated in 2020, when the Economic Development Plan was amended, the roll of the Citizens Advisory Review Committee changed to overseeing the program. The Advisory Committee has expressed that they would like to be involved again in the application process. The City Administrator advised that he will take another look into this and see what can be done.

The City Administrator presented the Council with the 2022 Tax Increment Financing (TIF) Annual Report. The report showed the progress of the redevelopment projects that were financed in whole or in part through TIF. This report will also be given to the taxing entities affected by such division of taxes. Moved by Swenson and seconded by Buse to accept the 2022 Tax Increment Financing Annual Report. Voting Yea: Stokely, Penrose, Swenson, Buse, Hugo, and Smith. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Morrow, Davies & Toelle, P.C (Cruise & Associates) has prepared the City's Audited Financial Statements for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2021 and each councilmember was provided a copy. Moved by Penrose, seconded by Stokely, to acknowledge receipt of the audit. Voting Yea: Stokely, Penrose, Swenson, Buse, Hugo, and Smith. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Moved by Swenson, seconded by Hugo, to approve the following applications for Special Designated Liquor Permits:

- (a) Rush's Liquor Store for the West Point Community Theatre fundraiser on April 30, 2022.
- (b) Cuming County Ag Society for the annual Cuming County Fair on August 11, 12, 13, and 14, 2022.
- (c) Cuming County Ag Society for Cuming County Fair events on August 13 and 14, 2022 at the Nielsen Center.
- (d) Cuming County Ag Society for the Cuming County Fair event on August 13, 2022 at Anderson Ballfield in Neligh Park

Voting Yea: Stokely, Penrose, Swenson, Buse, Hugo, and Smith. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Moved by Smith, seconded by Swenson, to approve the claim of Hugo Plumbing & Heating for services and supplies in the amount of \$4,428.43. Voting Yea: Stokely, Penrose, Swenson, Buse, and Smith. Nay: None. Abstaining: Hugo. Motion carried.

The City Administrator then announced the following:

- 1. That there will be an open house at the Water Treatment Plant on Thursday, April 14<sup>th</sup> from 3:00-5:00 PM for people to see the improvements made at the plant.
- 2. Advised that the Police Department is putting together a program with Core Health for the officers to utilize that facility.
- 3. JEO Engineers are doing an overall review of the levee project and the current agreements.

Moved by Swenson, seconded by Smith, to adjourn at 6:12 P.M. Voting Yea: Stokely, Penrose, Swenson, Buse, Hugo, and Smith. Nay: None. Motion carried.
