The Mayor then opened a public hearing on the application of Thunderhead Brewing Taproom, LLC dba Thunderhead Brewing Taproom for a Class CG liquor license at 139 S. Main Street. All parties were given an opportunity to be heard. No one appeared to speak in opposition of the liquor license application and no correspondence had been filed. The Mayor then closed the hearing. Moved by Smith, seconded by Penrose, to approve the application of Thunderhead Brewing Taproom, LLC dba Thunderhead Brewing Taproom for a Class CG liquor and that the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission be notified of this action. Voting Yea: Stokely, Penrose, Swenson, Buse, Hugo, and Smith. Nay: None. Motion carried.

The City Administrator advised that last month the Council had decided to remove the 2-hour parking restriction on a portion of Park Street on the south side between Main and Mill Streets. At that time, it was requested to remove the 2-hour parking on the north side of Park Street. As it was not on the agenda, the Council could not act on that request. So the matter is before the Council now to consider. Stokely introduced a resolution that the two-hour parking restriction be removed and deactivated in the following area: On the north side of Park Street from the intersection of Main and Park Streets west to the alley between Main and Mill Streets, and that this resolution shall be in force as soon as the 2-Hour Parking signs can be removed from this area. Swenson seconded the motion. Voting Yea: Stokely, Penrose, Swenson, Buse, Hugo, and Smith. Nay: None. Motion carried and said resolution adopted.

The Council reviewed the application of the Bohemian Duck for the addition of an outdoor area approximately 51' x 21' and that said area be included in its liquor license. Moved by Smith and seconded by Stokely to approve this application and notify the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission of such approval. Voting Yea: Stokely, Penrose, Swenson, Buse, Hugo, and Smith. Nay: None. Motion carried.

The City Administrator was requesting authorization to sell the 2004 Ford Expedition, which was a former police vehicle. Swenson introduced a resolution whereas the City of West Point is the owner of a 2004 Ford Expedition having a value of greater than \$5,000 and authorizing the sale of said vehicle by auction, bid, or scrap/salvage; that the Mayor and City Clerk are authorized to execute all necessary documents relating thereto; and that notice of sale shall be published once

in a legal newspaper at least seven days prior to the sale of the property. Penrose seconded the motion. Voting Yea: Stokely, Penrose, Swenson, Buse, Hugo, and Smith. Nay: None. Motion carried and said resolution adopted.

The City Administrator reported to the Council that the City has applied for the American Rescue Plan Act funds through the State of Nebraska. The deadline to apply for these funds was July 2, 2021. These are federal funds and will be received in two installments with the first installment being \$290,525, which funds should be distributed to the City within 30 days. More information will be coming on disbursing the funds and the required reporting. An eligible possibility would be infrastructure projects. The Council will be kept updated on this.

The City Administrator advised that the Water Treatment Plant Improvement Project and the Water Main Improvement Project were done rather quickly in order to get the new filters on line. There were several items that were not included in the original projects such as the water treatment plant roof and well rehab. Also needed is the equipment to be in compliance with the copper levels. Therefore, it is necessary to amend the loan agreement with the Nebraska Department of Environment and Energy. The original loan was not to exceed \$2,765,000. It is proposed to amend the loan agreement to \$3,500,000 with \$700,000 being forgiven. Following discussion, Buse introduced Ordinance No. 1422 entitled:

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF AN AMENDMENT TO AN EXISTING LOAN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF WEST POINT, NEBRASKA AND THE NEBRASKA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT AND ENERGY; AND AUTHORIZING CERTAIN ACTIONS AND DOCUMENTS AND PRESCRIBING OTHER MATTERS RELATING THERETO,

and moved that the statutory rule requiring reading on three different days be suspended. Swenson seconded the motion. Voting Yea: Stokely, Penrose, Swenson, Buse, Hugo, and Smith. Nay: None. Motion carried. Statutory rule suspended. Stokely moved for final passage of the ordinance, which motion was seconded by Swenson. Voting Yea: Stokely, Penrose, Swenson, Buse, Hugo, and Smith. Nay: None. Ordinance adopted.

The City Administrator advised the Council that the City has received notification from the Nebraska Department of Environment and Energy that the City's public water system is in exceedance of the copper level. About 40 water samples are taken from various residences every 6 months. The residences sampled are to be built in 1988 or earlier. He wanted to clarify that the water coming out of the water treatment plant has no copper in it. The copper levels come from the

piping in the homes. He further stated that orthophosphate will be injected into the water at the treatment plant to essentially coat the lines to prevent the leaching of copper into the home's drinking water. A notice will be published in the newspaper but are still waiting for the wording of the notice from the NDEE. After this is done, another round of sampling will take place. The Lead and Copper Rule has been very controversial especially when it comes to the sampling protocol. Stokely suggested that all this be communicated to the public in a comprehensive manner.

Moved by Buse, seconded by Swenson, to approve the claim of Hugo Plumbing & Heating for services and supplies in the amount of \$4,908.58. Voting Yea: Stokely, Penrose, Swenson, Buse, and Smith. Nay: None. Abstaining: Hugo. Motion carried.

The Council decided to hold a workshop for the 2021-2022 budget on Wednesday, July 28th at 5:00 PM. Because of recent legislation, the Council must hold a public hearing on the proposed budget statement and this hearing is be held separately from any regular meeting and it cannot be limited by time. The Council decided to hold the public hearing on the proposed budget statement on Thursday, September 2, 2021 at 5:30 PM.

Swenson introduced a resolution to approve Change Order No. 1 and Payment No. 6 to Layne Christensen Company for the West Point Water Treatment Plant Project in the amount of \$3,600.00. Buse seconded the motion. Voting Yea: Stokely, Penrose, Swenson, Buse, Hugo, and Smith. Nay: None. Motion carried and said resolution adopted.

Smith introduced a resolution to approve Payment No. 4 to Rutjens Construction for the West Point Water Main Improvement Project in the amount of \$41,714.04. Swenson seconded the motion. Voting Yea: Stokely, Penrose, Swenson, Buse, Hugo, and Smith. Nay: None. Motion carried and said resolution adopted.

Moved by Penrose, seconded by Swenson, to adjourn at 6:05 P.M. Voting Yea: Stokely, Penrose, Swenson, Buse, Hugo, and Smith. Nay: None. Motion carried.
